## BYLAW 98-3

A BYLAW OF THE TOWN OF LAMPMAN FOR THE PURPOSE OF CLOSING OF A PORTION OF FOURTH AVENUE EAST IN REGISTERED PLAN C2663 AND PLAN V1963

WHEREAS, Notice was given by publication thereof in Carlyle Observer, a weekly newspaper circulated in the Town of Lampman in the Province of Saskatchewan, published in Carlyle, in the Province of Saskatchewan, in the issues of September 7, 1998, and September 14, 198, of the intension of the Council of the Town of Lampman to close a portion of Fourth Avenue East as noted herein.

AND WHEREAS the Minister of Highways and Transportation of the Province of Saskatchewan has consented to the said closing;

AND WHEREAS the provisions of Section 156 of The Urban Municipality Act, 1984, have been fully complied with and no person has claimed that his land will be injuriously affected thereby, nor petitioned the Council to be heard in connection with this Bylaw;

NOW THEREFORE, the Council of the Town of Lampman, in the Province of Saskatchewan, enacts as follows:

1. That the following be closed:

"All that portion of Fourth Avenue East, Lampman, Saskatchewan, Plan C2663, lying to the North East of a line being the production South Easterly of the South West limit of Block 8 and to the South West of a line joining the North East corner of Block 8 on said Plan with the North West corner of Block K Plan V1963."

 That the Minister of Highways and Transportation for the Province of Saskatchewan be and is requested to convey title for the said street as contained in paragraph 1 hereof to the Town of Lampman.
